a great shortage of water for the village since the

only water storage consists of two very small tanks. The clerk was instructed to write to the Glendale Rural District Council calling their attention to the matter and asking them to increase the accommodation for water storage for the village.

Wark Water Supply. The report of the Water Committee of the Glendale Rural District Council was received as follows:

The Chairman of the Water Committee and I inspected the Wark Water Supply on May 31st 1940. There seemed to be an ample supply in the tanks and the overflow was running

at the rate of 180 gallons per hour at 10.30 a. m.

This indicates that there should be no shortage in the village and it is recommended that no new scheme be put in hand at present, but that the position be watched carefully during the summer. arrangements have been made for this to be done.

This report was considered very unsatisfactory since it contained no proposal to improve the supply of water to the village and after considerable discussion it was agreed that the following resolution proposed by Mr. Proudlock and seconded by Mr. Barr be sent to the Glendale Rural District Council.

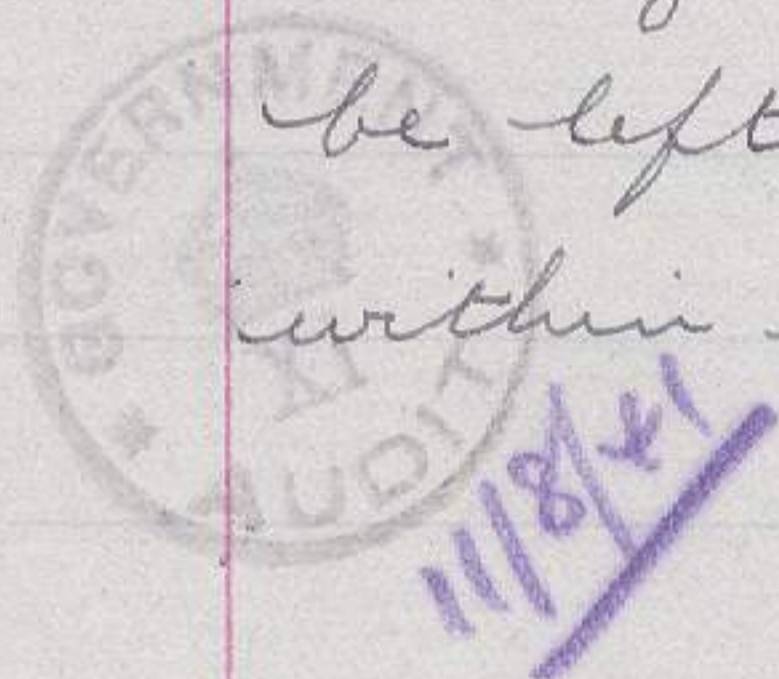
"That the water supply to Wark Village is most unsatisfactory on two or three days per week at least ten houses are without water for from three to six hours. It is therefore requested that the Glendale Rural District Council take steps to have the storage tanks enlarged as it is most essential that there should be a plentiful supply of water for the Village."

It also recommended that as many private individuals as possible should buy their own stirrup pumps, these could be bought through the Glendale Council for £1.-.
