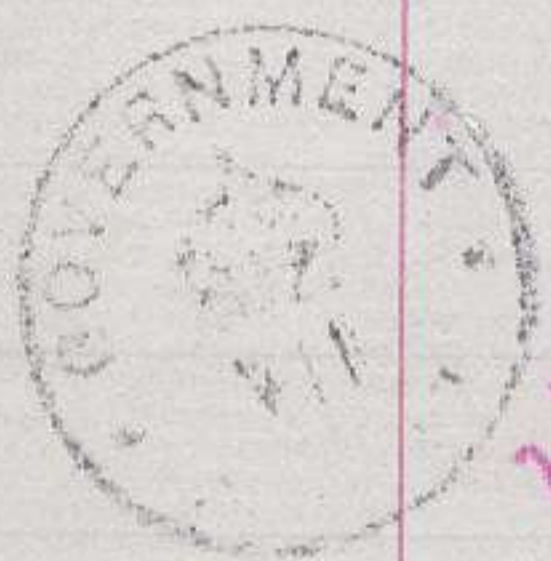

Parish Councils Association: Correspondence from the Northumberland Parish Councils Association was read and after some discussion it was agreed that Barham Parish Council join the association for one or two years and that at the end of this period the question of continuing membership be considered.

Wark water  
Supply.

Mr Proudlock drew attention to the fact that so far nothing had been done to provide the village of Wark with an adequate supply



of water. During the summer of last year the supply was extremely bad some of the houses being without water for several days. Agreed that a letter be sent to the Glendale R.D.C pointing out the seriousness of the position and asking that they once more go into the matter with a view to providing the village with a good supply of water without delay.

Electricity to  
Wark.

Supply of Electricity to Wark Village: Alderman Chantres asked whether any move had been made with regard to having a supply of electricity brought to the village. Mr W.S. Davidson pointed out that electric current is already supplied to the farm but that the electric cables do not pass through the village. Mr Proudlock promised to get a list of names of people who wish to have electricity and the Parish Council agreed to give their support.

Housing.

Housing: Attention was called to the fact that in their housing programme for Glendale the District Council had made no provision for the erection of houses within the parish of Barham. Agreed to ask the Glendale R.D.C that in their future housing schemes provision be made for the building of some houses within this parish.

The clerk was instructed to ascertain from the Scottish Southern Electric Co. when it is intended to have Electricity brought to the village.

Mark Water Supply: It was reported that the new supply would probably be installed in the near future.

Housing: a letter from the Glendale R. D. C. stated that when considering the programme for 1948 the question of new houses for barham Parish would be borne in mind.

Footpath from Beusson to Sunilaws: A letter from the clerk to the Northumberland County Council stated that he had investigated the position with regard to this footpath and that it seemed probable that the ploughing up of the path had been done by the farmer's employees in ignorance of the fact that it was a public right of way. The farmer had confirmed that a strip of land five or six feet wide along the boundary of the fence would not be sown.

The members expressed satisfaction with this reply to their complaint.

Wark Water Supply and Sewerage: Attention was drawn to the fact that the village is still without an adequate water supply, a number of the villagers having to carry water for quite a long distance. Mr Leantree stated that an Engineer from the Ministry of Health would be visiting Glendale very soon and that most likely he would go into the question of Wark Water Supply. It was agreed that a letter be sent to the Glendale R.D. pointing out the urgency of the matter and asking that something be done without delay.

Learmouth Church Yard: Mr Brown called attention to the state of this old Church Yard. The wall is gradually falling away thus allowing stock to enter and graze. Agreed to write the Barham Parochial Church Council requesting



that they look into the matter.
